
Tonight's Touchstone Family Association's Annual General Meeting provides a welcome opportunity to celebrate the successes of the past year and to plan for the future.



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Executive Director's Report




The annual report this year includes art created by children. Such joie de vivre! It matters not if it's a masterpiece but simply that it done with the joy of life and of creating with colour. That is the essence of childhood, a child's sense of the world belonging to them, or at least for the time being. Sadly that spontaneity is often lost in the organised world of parenthood.

In saying that, I would comment that there has been an interesting evolution and change in our culture that has led us to a somewhat child-centred approach within family life. Like all well intended changes, too often we do not see, or we lose sight of the unintended consequences of our own behaviour. With family divorce being at an all time high, it is important to remain mindful of the primary importance of a healthy marriage and partnership in the context of the family.

It is all too common these days to see parents focus on involving their children in a myriad of activities. For many, it is finishing the work day and into the car as Mom drives one to soccer practice and Dad drives the other to a swimming lesson and maybe then off to a Parent/Teacher meeting or back to work. All of this being done in the interest of providing children with the best opportunities afforded them. Often it can be at the cost of not keeping the spontaneity, creativity and color needed to nurture their own relationship. It is not just taking care of business of everyday life but also about Mom and Dad taking care of each other and their relationship.

We owe it to our children to model the concepts of healthy adult relationships. We need children to see us create joy and nurture other core relationships that are the key to healthy family life.

Support, counselling and mediation to preserve the family unit; offered in partnership with the Ministry for Children and Family Development.

Community Action Plan for Children (CAP-C)
A federally-funded program that provides a supportive learning environment for new Canadian families with young children.

Restorative Justice Program
Repairs harm done to victims in the community through a supportive environment where youth are held accountable for their actions.

Francis House
A residential care program that provides opportunities for youth to stabilize and improve their behavior and supports their move to a family care environment.


Touchstone Day Program
Focuses on preparing youth for school readiness in a structured setting, addressing life skills development in a continuum of services.

Front-Porch (Open-Access) Program
Families who believe they will benefit from support/counselling services are seen on a self-referral basis.


